Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2013-2014 educational progress for the Madison Virtual Academy. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Stephanie Vandenbossche, for assistance.

The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the following web site, www.madisonschools.k12.mi.us, or you may review a copy in our main office at your child's school.

The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

Our school has not been given one of these labels. The Madison Virtual Academy has been identified with a red overall color status. This status is due to one or more core subject areas with overall low proficiency. The area that is identified for improvement is in the area of Science. Our school has also been identified as having certain grade levels not meeting the tested participation rate of 95%. We recognize these challenges that are presented through online coursework and continue to strive to meet proficiency and attendance goals.

The online learning program offers an opportunity to all students in grades 1-12 who live in the Oakland Intermediate School District or any Intermediate School District that is contiguous to Oakland County. Grades 1-5 may take non-core classes through community resource classes, online courses or other approved educational options. Grades 6-12 may take six non-core classes through the same options as noted above. Grades 6-12 may participate full-time if they take four core classes along with two non-core electives. Madison District Public Schools provides mentoring for full-time students. This blended learning opportunity supports students in a non-traditional setting and is working to close the achievement gap for a population of students that respond to this learning environment. Our online program is designed to provide a variety of coursework, including world languages, that would not be available, through the traditional high school setting. Our population of approximately 350 students has the flexibility of

the online environment combined with the face-time mentoring at five different location sites held Monday through Friday.

The core curriculum follows the state-mandated core curriculum in preparing our students for the MEAP, MME and college and career readiness. Our students must meet the MMC (Michigan Merit Curriculum) graduation requirement in coursework and must pass 21 credits.

The attached combined data report will outline the achievement results and accountability details by subgroup.

As administrator for the Madison Virtual Academy, I am proud of the efforts of our students. This learning environment is meeting the needs for many students and families in a non-traditional setting. I look forward to the continued success of the Academy in preparing our students for their future college and career path. We continue to provide a wealth of course offerings and to evaluate and revise our program as needed to meet the needs of all students.
